HOW TO HELP YOUR CHILD

- Read with your child at home. If possible, at least 3 times a week. Alternatively allow your child to read independently and then challenge them to summarise what they have read to you.
- Practise spellings, this can be done on paper or online using Spelling Shed.
- ➤ Encourage your child to develop their independence by organising their own resources for the day.
- Remind your child to hand in any letters or reply slips to their teacher.
- Check your child's reading packet each day.
- Check Class Dojo for any messages and updates of learning.

THINGS TO REMEMBER

MONDAY is spelling test day. New spellings can be accessed on Spelling Shed from the previous Monday – children each have their logins.
